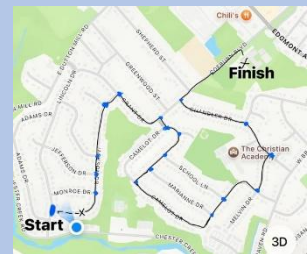

What's in a Name -- Brookhaven

In 1946 the Chester Times ran a series of articles tracing the origin, history or story behind the names of places in Delaware County. In the headline of one they stated, "**Brookhaven Name Mystery.**"

Originally, this area was part of Chester Township and was called Sneath's Corner and later referred to as Beatty's Corner. One longtime resident believed the Beatty family chose the name *Brookhaven* in memory of a local man named Brooks Nelling. There was a belief they combined his first name with "haven" to make it an appropriate village name. Others interviewed had no idea where the name originated.

In a follow up article published several days later, an unnamed local historian offered another explanation. At a time when it was necessary for folks to create their own amusement and good times, there was a Lyceum at Sneath's Corner. Because too many "city slickers" strolling out Middletown Rd. mockingly called it "Sneaks Corner", the Lyceum sponsored a contest for the most euphonious (pleasing or sweet to the ear) name for the crossroads. **Brookhaven** was the winner!

Sneath's Corner / Beatty's Corner – intersection of Edgmont Ave. & Brookhaven Rd. Sneath's General Store was located where Houser's Automotive sits today.

Lyceum – has multiple meanings, including: 1) a public facility used for lectures and debates, 2) educational facility that hosts educational events, 3) an academic high school that prepares students for higher education. In this article, it is assumed that the Lyceum stood on the SW corner of Edgmont and Brookhaven which once stood the George Washington School (now Walgreen's).
